But it didn't take long for NU to become a powerhouse and feared competitor by winning the Dad Vails that first year and within 8 years had won two Eastern Sprints. Now in the 6th decade, over a thousand athletes have competed and built a rich history giving it all to carry the banner of Husky Rowing.

Goals to Ensure the Legacy

To achieve the NURA's Mission to engage alumni and friends to support the Men's Rowing program so it achieves the highest level of competitiveness, it requires a focus and effort to raise the money that will position and elevate all elements of the program. That is why the NURA is working with Northeastern to raise an endowment and annual support with these goals.

Needs of Men's Rowing

Northeastern provides a significant investment annually in Men's Rowing. But there is a need for additional operating and capital equipment items to keep and elevate the program to be competitive with the top programs in the country, over and above NU's commitment. Those needs are \$160,000 to \$200,000 annually as outlined in the 2023 needs plan listed below.
